#### What are your strengths as a trainer?

I think that one of my strengths as a trainer is that I love the animals that I train. I get to know them individually, and for this reason, they tend to try harder for me in the show ring.

#### What is your favorite part of your job?

I love to make a horse. By this, I mean taking an unbroke, undiscovered animal, and train it into (hopefully) a winner. Some of my most successful wins as a professional have come from horses that had never been shown, or discovered. In my opinion, this is the best feeling of accomplishment!

#### What is your least favorite?

Poor sportsmanship amongst owners and competitors.

#### What is your favorite division?

Western Pleasure!!!

#### Do you own any horses of your own?

Yes, I own 3 1/2 (a foal on the way!).

**Do you own your own place?** No.

How many horses do you have in training? Currently 25.

#### Are there an average number of horses that you like/prefer to keep in training?

I don't like to exceed about 25 horses in training. Arabians are individuals, and I find that if I overload myself, I lose that one-to-one knowledge of my horses. When I became a professional, I vowed never to let my program turn into an assembly line.

#### Do you have an assistant(s) that helps you?

I have two assistants, that help me a ton!

#### What characteristics are important to you in finding a horse for one of your clients?

It depends upon the ability of the rider. For an amateur horse, I look for a quality, good legged animal, with easy gaits, and a super attitude. Quality and movement are a must!!!!

#### Lastly, what is your favorite horse show and why?

Scottsdale!!! Arizona in February, There is no comparison!!!!

## MAHA Spring Fling Wrap Up Report

Despite Mother Nature's best efforts the MAHA Spring Fling at the Minnesota Equestrian Center in Winona was a phenomenal success. Spectators filled the bleachers and enthusiasm was palpable as the show got underway Friday morning, March 25.

There were 32 more horses in attendance this year with 180 more class entries. Reining in particular showed a remarkable increase with 53 total classes, up 24 from last year.

Nearly all classes were sponsored and both Corporate Sponsorships and Patronships increased as well.

As usual, the show was well organized and the volunteers put forth amazing efforts to make sure the weekend went smoothly. MAHA hospitality was enjoyed by all with coffee, tea, hot chocolate, and donuts available throughout the show. We went through 100 pounds of candy, over 1000 cups of coffee, two100-people serving sheet birthday cakes, three Sam's club cases of creamer, and the list could go on and on!

MAHA gives back to its members and did so in a big way with payouts totaling \$1375 in the jackpot classes. Novice Rider Jackpot classes in both western and hunt seat were new this year.

The silent auction benefiting MAHA youth was the weekend highlight and raised more than \$1300.



## **April 9 MAHA Spring Clinic Report**



Saturday, April 9, was the well-attended, day-long clinic at Conway Arabians in Chatfield. Conway Arabians's trainer Tom Theisen was featured demonstrating many skills – ground driving youngsters and junior horses, to hopping aboard more seasoned horses – generously sharing his horse training philosophies, tips and how to information. Groomer extraordinaire, Darcy Gray, did a hands-on demonstration about clipping and grooming a show horse. The Arabian Horse Times's John Diedrich showed his main ring halter trainer/handler talents. Hosts Conway Arabians's Lori and Peter Conway showed how to be an effective team and quiet communicator when teaching a horse to load for the first time.





Region 10 News Bullet Points

From Laura Mickelson, Region 10 Director

- 1. Tentative schedules for all National shows are on the AHA website under each competition.
- 2. Canadian Nationals will be held in Brandon, Manitoba, Canada—hotels and restaurant information is on the Canadian Nationals home page.

- 3. US Nationals 3 & Under and 4 & Over Championships will include champion and reserve from each of the qualifying classes plus next 4 highest scoring horses from the qualifying classes so that the grand championship will have 10 horses. These horses will be judged comparatively AS A NEW CLASS. Any horse from the Top Ten can be champion or reserve. All five judges will judge with all scores counting. The high and low will NOT be thrown out.
- 4. Maturity Classes: Starting in 2012, the English and Country English Pleasure Maturity classes will be for horses 5 and 6 years of age. For 2011, they continue to be for 4 and 5 year old horses. A horse can only compete in the maturity classes two times so if a 4 year old showed in the Maturity in 2010; it can either show as a 5 year old in 2011 or a 6 year old in 2013 BUT NOT BOTH. A 4 year old competing in the Maturity in 2011 can either show as a 5 year old in 2012 or a 6 year old in 2013 BUT NOT BOTH or skip the 2011 Maturity and show in 2012 (as a 5 year old) and 2013 (as a 6 year old).
- 5. Motion to add Breeding/In Hand Committee as Tier B committee passed but the motions to add Pleasure committees did not pass.
- 6. Motion to change AHA's position concerning humane slaughter did not pass. AHA will continue to take the position that people should have a choice of humane slaughter.
- 7. There was no vote on the Regional Boundaries resolutions but the Committee will continue to gather information and present recommendations.
- 8. A strategic plan is being worked on and I (Laura) will be asking you all to participate
- 9. Also, it is suggested that for liability purposes, that each show post a notice in the show office, barns and by arenas, that safety helmets are allowed without penalty in ANY class. If you are having dressage be sure to designate a dressage warm up area. Otherwise, everyone is required to wear a helmet.

I went over and asked her to sit down again, explaining that I would open the door for her to see Dream. With his stall door open, Dream walked over and put his head in her lap! She wept, then petted, hugged and kissed him and it wasn't long before we were all in tears. Before they left the younger woman explained that her mother suffers from Alzheimer's saying that she remembers no one, but speaks clearly about the Arabian horses she once owned! I will remember this incident to the day I die. Dream seemed to sense what she needed and was happy to comply. This is a perfect example of what you are missing if you don't attend EXPO. The crowd obviously loves the Arabian horses the best. For reasons that are so evident, so do we!
