Responsibilities to AHYA include, but are not limited to:

Attending the AHYA Board meeting in Colorado usually in March

Coordinating and attending the AHYA Convention in July 2014 (Youth Nationals)

Attending the AHYA Board meeting held after the U.S. Nationals in the fall

Fundraising

Soliciting youth to affiliate with AHYA

Submit reports of your activities (Regional Board & Youth Coordinator - for the Regional meetings) & AHYA Coordinator.

The cost that will be incurred by you during this directorship includes transportation, meals and lodging for the AHYA Board meetings, the AHYA Convention and the October AHYA meeting. The Region 10 board has a line item budget for the Youth Director and Vice Youth Director. The Region 10 Board has budgeted \$2,000.00 for 2014.

The Youth Director & Vice Director serves a one year term. The new Youth Director & Vice Director will not take over until after the 2014 Youth Convention at Youth Nationals.
